This weekend there are so many people to thank.

Thirdly we have had a run of funerals in the last six weeks. Many families would be feeling the pain of loss at the moment. Behind the scenes an enormous amount of work goes into preparing and celebrating a funeral well. It does not end at the graveside as many families return to the hall for a wake, refreshments and the sharing of memories. The hospitality and warmth and love shown in the hall afterwards are most important. I'd like to commend Marie Twohill and her dedicated band of helpers, their work is indispensable. John Reynolds and our musicians turn up faithfully for every funeral and make my job as celebrant so much easier. The parish admin team not only prepare the booklets and make the bookings they often come up and pour the teas and coffees and then stay to sweep and clean up afterwards, then go back and finish their own work and often get ready for the next one.

Why do we put so much effort in to doing funerals well? It is because honouring the deceased is the Sixth Corporal Work of Mercy. Funerals give us the opportunity to grieve and show others support during difficult times. Through our prayers and actions during these times we show our respect for life, which is always a gift from God, and comfort to those who mourn. Funerals help us find our hope in the Resurrection. Praying for the living and the dead is also one of the Spiritual Works of Mercy.

I begin annual leave this weekend, please make welcome Fr. John Darbyshire who will relieve for me.

# Life's Obstacles

In the popular 1994 movie *The Shawshank Redemption,* the character Andy is wrongly convicted of murder and is incarcerated in the notoriously harsh Shawshank Prison. Andy works in the prison library which has very few resources except for some old tattered books and magazines. He begins a campaign to improve and expand the library and approaches the prison warden for funds.

The warden is reluctant to spend taxpayers' money on luxuries for convicted criminals. Andy is not deterred and so he asks the warden's permission to write to the State Senate for funds. Despite believing Andy's efforts are a waste of time, the warden promises to personally mail the letters.

Andy sets about sending one letter a week to the Senate, asking for assistance, believing that they can't ignore him forever. It takes six years but to Andy's amazement boxes of books are delivered to the prison, together with a cheque for \$200. A note is attached from the Senate stating that they now consider the matter closed!

Some of the prison officers are surprised that Andy's persistence has paid off. Andy becomes even more determined and starts writing two letters a week! The State realises Andy can't be bought off with \$200 and a few boxes of books. In the hope of silencing him, the State approves an annual payment of \$500. Andy made that \$500 stretch as far as it would go. He did deals with book clubs and charity groups. The library was refurbished and it became *the* place to be. It was the best prison library in all of New England.

Despite the desperate situation he found himself in and the many obstacles he faced, Andy never gave up. His determination, his persistence and his commitment were rewarded. In today's gospel, we have another person in a desperate situation, with all sorts of cultural and social obstacles standing in her way.

A Canaanite woman, a descendant of one of the ancient enemies of Israel, approaches Jesus but is initially not welcomed. Still she persists in her request. She is a mother and her daughter is suffering. Naturally she is bold and tenacious when the life of a loved one is at stake. She refuses to be put off or give up.

Although rebuffed by the disciples and ignored by Jesus, her sheer persistence has surprising results. Her persistence is seen by Jesus as evidence of great faith. He relents and heals her daughter.

Sometimes we struggle with persistence. We can give up when things become difficult. We can lose hope when things don't turn out as we planned. We can even stop praying when we don't get what we ask for. Whatever our situation, let us be persistent in our efforts, never giving up, and recognising God is always with us.
