31ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME -YEAR A 5 November 2017

Jesus the mediator

Today's readings are directed at those who have positions of authority in the Church. Those who have failed and those who have succeeded. In the first reading, the prophet Malachi condemns the leaders. "You have turned aside from the way, and have caused many to falter by your instruction."

In the second reading from the first letter to the Thessalonians, St Paul provides a positive model of the Christian pastor. "Brothers and sisters, we were gentle among you, as a nursing mother cares for her children. With such affection for you, we were determined to share with you not only the gospel of God, but our very selves as well, so dearly beloved had you become to us."

But in Matthew's gospel, Jesus condemns those in positions of authority who fail to meet his ideal. The scribes and Pharisees are left wanting. First, they do not practice what they preach. Second, they impose burdens on others and do nothing to help them. Third, they exploit their positions of authority rather than serve others.

In the verse that immediately follows today's reading, Jesus himself is harsher still than the prophet Malachy. "But woe to you scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites. For you lock people out of the kingdom of heaven."

Pope Francis has used similar language. In his homily during Mass at Domus Sanctae Marthae about a year ago, the pope said Jesus often accuses those who rigidly adhere to the law of being hypocrites; they are not free children of God, but "are slaves of the law."

The pope explained that behind this inflexibility, "there is always something else. And that is why Jesus says, 'Hypocrites!' There is something hidden in that person's life." There is also some kind of illness in such a rigid pastor. Inflexibility is not a gift of God, he said. "Meekness, yes, benevolence, yes, forgiveness, yes, but rigidity, no."

Pope Francis said God prefers "mercy, tenderness, goodness, meekness and humility." God's law was made not "to make us slaves but to make us free, to make us children" of God. Those who are rigid suffer when they realise they are not free, he said. Priests, and presumably others with positions of authority in the Church should not be functionaries of a system of laws, but mediators. The genuine pastor will be a mediator of God's love to God's people and will lose himself in the service of others.

Pope Francis describes how such a pastor would act when seeking to help people in difficult personal situations. A pastor cannot feel that it is enough simply to apply moral laws to those living in 'irregular' situations, as if they were stones to throw at people's lives. The job of the Church is not to exclude but to welcome, and the job of priests is not to render judgment but to listen and understand the context of people's lives and decisions.

Proposed legislation to legalise assisted suicide and euthanasia will be debated in the Parliament of New South Wales on the 16 November. Similar bills are expected to be introduced in other states in the near future.

Let your members of parliament know that you support increased access to better aged care and mental health services, disabilities assistance and excellent palliative care, rather than the legalisation of assisted suicide and euthanasia which would place the most vulnerable patients at risk as well as undermining the relationship between patients and healthcare professionals which is based on trust and mutual respect.
