A life serving others

Jesus' parable of an approaching wedding feast, an absent master, and good and bad servants might at first appear to us somewhat arcane, or at least culturally specific to a very different world to the one in which we live. We need, therefore, to ask a deeper question. That is; what is Jesus trying to tell us by this story?

At one level the parable may seem to be saying to us to be on our guard, watchful and alert, as we don't know what calamity awaits us around the corner! However, Jesus begins his discourse with just the opposite piece of advice: *"There is no need to be afraid, little flock, for it has pleased the Father to give you the kingdom*!"

So, Jesus is not directing us to fear the future, but inviting us to live in the present with the right attitude, acknowledging the gifts we have been given, and setting our hearts on a life of service: *"sell your possessions and give alms."* This is the truly counter-cultural challenge that Jesus presents to us today: don't live your life to gain wealth for yourselves, but live it to serve others in love. This is the life of the kingdom or "reign of God."

Jesus reminds us: *"where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."* If our major life-focus is the gaining of wealth, power or prestige, then we have every reason to be afraid lest misfortune makes us poor, powerless and unimportant in the eyes of the world. However, if our life is primarily directed towards loving service of others, we have nothing to fear, as we are already living the life of the kingdom.

Another perspective on today's gospel is given to us in the first reading from the Book of Wisdom where the Israelites celebrate the original Passover when God heard the cries of the people and delivered them from their enemies. Rather than focus on the future which is beyond our control, we are invited to remember and re-enact all that God has already done and continues to do for us.

In fact, the Eucharist is itself a re-enactment of Jesus' Last Supper and offering of his Body on Calvary in order that we may live. The Greek word for *Eucharist* means *Thanksgiving*. Every time we celebrate the Eucharist we remember and reenact what God has given to us in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.

To return to the master-servant language in Jesus' parable, there is an implicit critique of what Pope Francis has called *"the sin of clericalism."* He reminds us that all Christians, including priests and other clerics, are called to belong to *"God's faithful people as servants, not the master*!" There is but one master, Jesus the Christ, who in giving his life for us also demonstrates that all genuine leadership is servantleadership.



As we move into this second stage of the Plenary Council journey, we continue to seek the wisdom of the Holy Spirit. Beginning in July 2019, we are invited to reflect on Scripture, Church teaching and our contemporary situation in order to discern the answer to this question:

SNAPSHOT REPORT 3

How is God calling us to be a Christ-centred Church that is:

PRAYERFUL AND EUCHARISTIC?

"When they were at table, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it and gave it to them. Their eyes were opened and they recognised him." (Luke 24:30-31)

This National Theme for Discernment is inspired by the voices of the People of God who shared how deeply they treasured the Eucharist and the sacramental and liturgical life of the Church. There was a call for stronger and more engaging preaching, with an emphasis on the Word of God and connection to daily life, some seeking a uniquely Australian expression of prayer and Eucharistic celebration, drawing from the wisdom and rituals of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and also bringing together the many migrant communities which make up the Church in Australia. There were many divergent expressions of ways in which people and communities encounter God through their experiences of prayer, music and liturgy, and a desire for catechesis, training and formation for those in ministries related to these.

From the Pastor ...

Thank you for your warm welcome on my return from holidays. Thank you to Fr. John who stood in for me whilst I was away.

In the next few weeks we will try and get our Parish Pastoral Council re-established. Today I'll update you on what a Parish Pastoral Council is.

Firstly its role -

Our Pastoral Council's role is to promote the Church's mission to live and communicate the love and values of Christ in our world.

Our Pastoral Council shares in the building of our parish community, with parishioners, in our efforts to live as followers of Christ.

Our Pastoral Council seeks to support our Pastor, working with him and each other.

Secondly Membership

The Pastoral Council consists of at least ten members. This includes the Parish Priest and Pastoral Representative. The parishioners recommend other members.

The Council seeks as broad a membership as possible, with a diversity of age, gender and ethnic origin. Each Pastoral Councillor represents the whole parish community, not one group. Council members attend a session of formation prior to the first meeting of the new council.

Lastly, How many meetings!!!

The Pastoral Council usually has a minimum of six meetings a year. A consensus approach is used in the process of making decisions, with all members offering a voice.

The Pastoral Council reports to the parish community regularly via the bulletin and at Mass, and seeks the input of parishioners usually by discussions, meetings, and conversations.

Many pastors, myself included have asked is it worth while having a Pastoral Council? Yes it is, it gives every parishioner a voice. It also helps me avoid the trap of only listening or noticing a select few.

Please consider the pastoral council in your prayers and pray for its successful re-establishment.
