Admitting our failings

When Bill joined AA, the first step was admitting that he was powerless when it came to alcohol. In order to heal from his sickness, he had to start again, at rock bottom. Now, rock bottom isn't a place where we feel too comfortable, but it's a place that can teach us a great deal. In fact, there are many spiritual guides who believe it's the place where we begin to grow spiritually. I think this was something the Pharisee in today's gospel didn't know.

You could say the Pharisee in Jesus' story is the total opposite of Bill. For him everything has to look right, with no chinks in the armour. If he were one of today's politicians, he'd be terrified that someone might detect a weakness, or find out about a mistake. He doesn't seem to know that image-building often comes at the expense of true human growth and insight. The problem is, once 'looking good' is the top priority, we human beings are in trouble. This poor old Pharisee has convinced himself that he has the right formula for life, but in fact he's completely wrong. Meanwhile, the tax collector, the one he despises, is clearly beloved of God. Go figure, as they say.

The Pharisee doesn't seem to know that religious grandiosity and 'big noting' yourself aren't really part of genuine spirituality. If he'd heard Jesus teaching that 'the last shall be first' he'd probably just be scratching his head in confusion. He doesn't understand that those who spend too much time trying to be first in the spiritual realm will never get there. He wouldn't have noticed that Jesus doesn't get upset with sinners, but only with those who refuse to admit their failings.

You could safely say the Pharisee hasn't realised that the times in our lives of weakness and suffering can often deliver to us our best life lessons. They help us to say goodbye to our religious pretensions and strip us bare. These times can make us think and feel about our faith in a way that we never did before. Sometimes we even get to see that we can grow more by doing it wrong than by doing it right. Our failings can help to keep us real, and grounded, even humble, (think of the tax collector). As the mystic Julian of Norwich explained: 'First there is the fall, and then we recover from the fall. Both are the mercy of God!'

This brings us back to Bill and to the tax collector, and to all the other people who don't necessarily fit in with our ideas about who is worthy before God. The Pharisee thought it was fine to despise and exclude such people. He didn't seem to know about the importance of loving others, in all their variety.


