Trust in our God given talents

Different people have different abilities. A person gifted with imagination or creativity may not be good at administration or finance. Someone with a flair for 'do it yourself' around the house may not be musical. A cook who is 'at home' in the kitchen may be completely lost when it comes to anything mechanical. Someone with sporting prowess may find computers and electronics out of their league.

The rich man in today's parable was aware of his servants' abilities. Before departing on his journey, he entrusted his property to each servant *in proportion to their ability*. He only gave as much responsibility as each one could shoulder. The first two servants worked according to their ability, increasing what had been entrusted to them. But the third did not. He simply returned the one talent he had been given. Fear held him back from using his ability to work for the extra he was capable of gaining. *"I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground."*

Fear can paralyse us. It causes us to withdraw, concentrating our attention on ourselves and our security. It freezes our capacity to take risks and to face the unknown. It tempts us to conserve and to obsess about certainties. Fear can strip us of confidence and prevent us from reaching our potential.

Jesus was aware of the power that fear wielded in people's lives. When he was at the end of his public life and soon to be executed, Jesus wanted his followers to continue what he'd begun and to embrace his great commission, *"Go into the whole world and preach the Gospel to every creature."* But Jesus knew that those who would come after him would encounter many problems. Their biggest problem would be their own fear. Yet Jesus was insistent, *"Do not be afraid."*

When Peter fell on his knees saying, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man," Jesus responded with compassion and understanding. "Do not be afraid, from now on you will fish for people." When fear threatened to hold Peter back, Jesus called him to let go and walk on with faith and trust. Talents are given to bear fruit, not to lie in the bank or be buried in the ground, safe and unused. It may seem prudent not to risk, but in the end God expects otherwise. "Take the talent from him and give it to the one with ten". In other words, 'use it or lose it'.

All of us have been gifted by God, each in our own way. If fear causes us to hide our God-given talents, then those around us are deprived. Jesus wants us to live our lives to the full, free from fear and always ready to share our abilities and talents for the good of all.

CHRISTMAS

Planning has commenced in the Parish Office for Christmas. *Based on the current regulations it will be* essential to book in for one of the three planned Christmas Masses! We are taking bookings now.

There will be two Masses on Christmas Eve (6 pm & 8 pm) and one on Christmas Day (9 am) at this stage. One of the Christmas Eve Masses will also be livestreamed.

With extra seating at the back of the church, each Christmas Mass will be able to accommodate up to 120 people based on the current 4 square metre rule. An additional Mass may be added if the bookings indicate a need for an extra Mass. If you are expecting family home for Christmas and therefore an increased family attendance at Mass, please consider booking early to help us with our planning.

We are all praying for some further relaxation in restrictions before Christmas.

MASS - What you need to know...

As at 23 October the number permitted to attend Masses and any church services continues to be determined by the 4 square metre distancing rule.

- all Masses will be celebrated in Sacred Heart Church (entry via main entrance only)
- signing in on arrival and hand sanitising
- it is still necessary to book for ALL weekend Masses including Saturday and Sunday

- seats are marked where you can sit
- please observe social distancing when coming forward for communion, and communion BY HAND only
- for the time being, we will not be having congregational singing
- church cleaned after each Mass
- covid-19 safety plan of action in place
