Little fanfare for Jesus' birth

When there is a major announcement of a forthcoming event, it is usually accompanied by a media statement and even a press conference. Sometimes social media influencers are also invited to create some excitement and "buzz"



around the announcement. Companies like Apple, Tesla and Boeing spend millions of dollars to launch their latest products worldwide.

Similarly, when a famous celebrity couple welcomes a new addition to the family, it's all over the news services and social media, sometimes for days on end. It's like no other news is worthy of airtime.

However, when God chose human form in Bethlehem, there was no spectacular announcement. There were no bells and whistles, no fireworks. In fact, there was nothing but a bright star that attracted little attention except for a few wise men who travelled from the east. The birth of Jesus probably didn't attract much interest outside the immediate families of Joseph and Mary, perhaps to spare Mary embarrassment such was the unusual nature of the baby's arrival.

The biggest event the universe has witnessed had taken place with little fanfare. In the scheme of things, this was even bigger than the creation of the universe itself. Even the universe must have 'held its breath'.

That speaks of God preferring to work quietly, unseen and unnoticed. Choosing to be like many of us who work quietly in our offices, schools, our homes.

For many people, our lives are simple and uneventful. Nothing spectacular happens and little that would warrant much outside attention. But it is in that simple, uneventful and unspectacular 'living' that God comes as one of us in order to bring us all closer to God. That's what happened to Joseph and Mary and that same invitation is also open to everyone. That's the underlying meaning of the name Emmanuel, "God is with us". That God wants to be with us in the very ordinariness of our lives.

The world today can sometimes be loud, vulgar and crass which is opposite to God coming to us in a quiet, ordinary way as a normal man. That's why the angel said to Joseph that there is no need to be afraid because God will come to be his son like any ordinary boy.

Big announcements and even big events will come, and they will go. Prominent companies and famous people will come and eventually be confined to the history books, but God is the one constant. Perhaps it is not us who waits for God, but God with loving patience who waits for us. We need to realise that God is amongst us now in our everyday, mundane lives and will be with us for all eternity.

ADVENT BANNERS

During the fourth week of Advent we reflect on the fact that God's chosen Messiah is about to come into the world.

We think about Mary, the mother of Jesus, and the risks she was taking when she said yes, to becoming the mother of the Messiah. Mary was a young girl from a small village where everyone knows everyone and everything they are doing. Mary lived in an occupied land and faced an unknown future with courage and joy. Her decision made it possible for us to discover what it means to live in Jesus.

We think about Joseph an honest, caring man who finds himself in a situation he does not expect. With help from God, Joseph makes a choice to protect, to nurture and care for Mary and her unborn baby. In his faithful listening and open heart, Joseph is a model for all to understand and love Jesus whose birth we prepare to celebrate.

Our symbols for this week are for Mary - a lily and Joseph - a hammer and a saw.

As the number of Covid cases are on the rise parishioners have raised concerns with the Pastoral Council regarding *The Sign of Peace* and the reception of *Holy Communion*.

We take this opportunity to remind everyone that at *The Sign of Peace* some members of the congregation might be more comfortable with a smile or a wave rather than a handshake.

A reminder also to those who are kneeling and/or receiving *Communion* on the tongue to please wait until the end of the Communion line.



REFLECTION.... Greg Sunter LIVING THE GOSPEL – ADVENT

Emmanuel; God-is-with-us – that's what we celebrate through Christmas and that's what we've been preparing for during Advent. We celebrate God-with-us in a particular time and place through our celebration of the birth of Jesus. But we remember it every year because we also use the Christmas celebration to remind ourselves that God continues to be with us. That is what is so remarkable about the Christmas season: that God-is-with-us **now**, not just in a stable in Palestine so many years ago, but now! Advent is the time to remind ourselves of this incredible truth and prepare ourselves to acknowledge it once again.

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

It appears from the passage that Mary's child is to be called both Jesus and Emmanuel. Emmanuel is not intended as a different name for Jesus but rather one of the many titles that will be applied to him. The title means God-is-with-us. That one word, Emmanuel, sums up the essence of Jewish and Christian belief. The Jewish people's faith in God was built on the basis that God travelled with them and through their lives. Christians believe that God took on an even closer sense of being with us through God's incarnation in the life of Jesus.



Expressions of Interest | Liturgy & Music Conference 28-30 September 2023 in Brisbane

The Pastoral Council invites interested parishioners to lodge an expression of interest to attend "The Art of Liturgical Celebration" Conference in September 2023. The Parish will partly subsidise registration fees for this Conference noting that those chosen to attend will be responsible for their own transport and accommodation fees. The amount subsidised for each attendee by the Parish will be dependent on the number of people who we register.

The international keynote speakers are well-known British liturgical composer Bernadette Farrell and U.S. liturgist and author Timothy O'Malley (Notre Dame). In addition, there will be many expert local workshop presenters and facilitators with 42 workshops on offer across the three days. It is rare to have expert liturgical musicians, liturgists and educators together in one place for three days of focused input, so this is a fabulous opportunity for some of us to attend. In addition to the high-quality keynotes and workshops, there will also be opportunities to engage in facilitated discussions and to build networks with liturgists, liturgical musicians and educators from around the country.
