THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT - Yr A 11 DECEMBER 2022

The need for patience while we wait

What are you like at waiting? As one person said: "I'm no good at waiting, but one day as I stood in line at a local supermarket I realised I was waiting. Waiting! I was doing what Advent is all about."



That's what John the Baptist, one of the striking Advent figures, is doing in today's gospel. Waiting in prison for news of the Messiah, wondering is this the one he'd been expecting? We all know the feeling given the expectations we might have of Jesus. Perhaps we like what John has said, his stress on the power and judgement of the One to come.

But Jesus says to John's disciples, tell him what you see and hear, that the blind, the lame, the deaf, the lives of those cast out have been transformed. He isn't fulfilling John's expectations so much as calling our attention to the prophecy of Isaiah which is referred to in the first reading.

The lives of those cast out are transformed and, as in Isaiah, where the wilderness blooms now the exile in Babylon is over, they too may return from a kind of exile, full of hope. In today's gospel these are the signs of the kingdom that Jesus points to, rather than God's retribution.

So, what do we see and hear? Can we glimpse the working of God among us in Advent? This may seem a daunting task because we're so caught up in the 'festive season' that any talk of slowing down is best left till Boxing Day. But what if we're able to see something else in what we're already doing? That's what the woman standing in the queue at the supermarket is doing; she's waiting and that's what Advent is about.

Could standing there, or wherever we find ourselves waiting be such a moment? Why not put the phone away and wait? And what about a more formal moment, as we light the third, pink candle of the Advent wreath today, on Gaudete or Rejoice Sunday?

Amidst the call to pray and to fast, we seek to light a candle and share that light with the forgotten ones, inviting them to eat with us, welcoming them into our lives. In pointing to the Christ who is to come John bears witness to this light. That's the point of his life, doubts and all, and why Jesus says there is none greater.

The point of our lives is to become more Christ-like and discover our 'greatness' in him. In doing so 'the least in the kingdom of Heaven will be greater' than John is. We rejoice that we're invited to help build up the kingdom and to enable this we must learn to be patient, as the second reading says, waiting in expectation of the Lord's coming, for he will come and is already present among us, not attempting to force God's hand.

In Advent, we're preparing a way for the Lord, realising, once again, that God so loves the world.

ADVENT BANNERS

Half way through Advent we pause for a moment to celebrate Gaudete Sunday. Its name is taken from the entrance antiphon of the Mass, which is: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near." This is a quotation from Philippians 4:4-5, and in Latin, the first word of the antiphon is Gaudete - "rejoice."

In the readings we hear about miracles associated with the Messianic age, its coming, and what we need to do to prepare. We also learn about the doubts of John the Baptist, how he dealt with them, and the blessing that makes us even more fortunate than John was. We reflect on the ways in which we can help others to follow Jesus more closely in their lives and the symbols for our banner this week are for people who helped to save others; David – a harp; and John – shell and water.

Say to the faint of heart: Be strong and do not fear.
Behold, our God will come, and he will save us.

EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST | LITURGY & MUSIC CONFERENCE 28-30 SEPTEMBER 2023 IN BRISBANE

The Pastoral Council invites interested parishioners to lodge an expression of interest to attend "The Art of Liturgical Celebration" Conference in September 2023. The Parish will partly subsidise registration fees for this Conference noting that those chosen to attend will be responsible for their own transport and accommodation fees. The amount subsidised for each attendee by the Parish will be dependent on the number of people who we register.

The international keynote speakers are well-known British liturgical composer Bernadette Farrell and U.S. liturgist and author Timothy O'Malley (Notre Dame). In addition, there will be many expert local workshop presenters and facilitators with 42 workshops on offer across the three days. It is rare to have expert liturgical musicians, liturgists and educators together in one place for three days of focused input, so this is a fabulous opportunity for some of us to attend. In addition to the high-quality keynotes and workshops, there will also be opportunities to engage in facilitated discussions and to build networks with liturgists, liturgical musicians and educators from around the country.

An Update from Fr. Anthony...

A couple of weeks ago I was sorting through some boxes, in one of them was all the cards and gifts that had been sent to me during my long stay in hospital. Every card had well wishes and the assurance of prayer. Those prayers have made an enormous impact on my recovery, I am very grateful for the hours so many of you have put in to praying for my recovery. I'm also grateful for your constant inquiries as to my current state of health. I miss very much being in active ministry, no doubt it will come in good time.

Last week was my one year anniversary of my surgery, I visited PA hospital to see my surgeons. The news was good and they were amazed at how well I had recovered in the previous twelve months. I still have a way to go but at least now I have the hope of a reasonable recovery and return to ministry sometime in the future.

My next appointment is in mid February which hopefully all going to plan should indicate a possible return to ministry. My guess is that I will return and start slowly and see what I can reasonably achieve, all this of course will be on the advice of my surgeon and doctor. So no firm date yet but getting closer.

I owe a huge debt of gratitude to the Parish Team at Sacred Heart Parish who have made sure that everything I need for a successful recovery is in place. The Diocese of Lismore has also been remarkable in their care and support for me. Thank you for your prayers and may you have a blessed, safe and Holy Christmas.
