Trust in our God given talents

Different people have different abilities. A person gifted with imagination or creativity may not be good at administration or finance. Someone with a flair for 'do it yourself' around the house may not be musical. A cook who is 'at home' in the kitchen may be completely lost when it comes to anything mechanical. Someone with sporting prowess may find computers and electronics out of their league.

The rich man in today's parable was aware of his servants' abilities. Before departing on his journey, he entrusted his property to each servant in proportion to their ability. He only gave as much responsibility as each one could shoulder. The first two servants worked according to their ability, increasing what had been entrusted to them. But the third did not. He simply returned the one talent he had been given. Fear held him back from using his ability to work for the extra he was capable of gaining. "I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground."

Fear can paralyse us. It causes us to withdraw, concentrating our attention on ourselves and our security. It freezes our capactiv to take risks and to face the unknown. It tempts us to conserve and to obsess about certainties. Fear can strip us of confidence and prevent us from reaching our potential.

Jesus was aware of the power that fear wielded in people's lives. When he was at the end of his public life and soon to be executed, Iesus wanted his followers to continue what he'd begun and to embrace his great commission, "Go into the whole world and preach the Gospel to every creature." But Iesus knew that those who would come after him would encounter many problems. Their biggest problem would be their own fear. Yet Jesus was insistent, "Do not be afraid."

When Peter fell on his knees saying, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man," Jesus responded with compassion and understanding. "Do not be afraid, from now on you will fish for people." When fear threatened to hold Peter back, Jesus called him to let go and walk on with faith and trust. Talents are given to bear fruit, not to lie in the bank or be buried in the ground, safe and unused. It may seem prudent not to risk, but in the end God expects otherwise. "Take the talent from him and give it to the one with ten". In other words, 'use it or lose it'.

All of us have been gifted by God, each in our own way. If fear causes us to hide our God-given talents, then those around us are deprived. Jesus wants us to live our lives to the full, free from fear and always ready to share our abilities and talents for the good of all.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL RESPONSES TO ANONYMOUS SUGGESTIONS

A number of questions, comments, suggestions, ideas are received by the Parish Pastoral Council through the Suggestion Box located at the back of the church.

At the recent Pastoral Council Meeting held on 9 November, the Pastoral Council with Fr Peter reviewed a number of the questions and we would like to share the responses to these questions/suggestions.

Catholic Bible Study Groups. Are we able to start a Catholic Bible Study Group? It could be on a certain theme or topic of interest? And run in blocks of a few weeks - then choose another theme or topic. This, or something similar, is under consideration for 2024.

ALPHA. When will we put the ALPHA course on again? Could we join with another Christian denomination locally to put it on together?

There is no plan to run Alpha again. On previous occasions when it has been held in this Parish there has been very poor attendance. However, please also see response to RCIA question below.

RCIA. Could you please print/advertise in Church Bulletins the day and time for RCIA Meetings? And/or as an extra now and again as part of evangelising our Catholic Faith a little leaflet or booklet to hand out to lapsed Catholics or people who are thinking or have questions about Catholicism? And/or the RCIA? (all part of the RCIA course). Times for RCIA are advertised at the commencement of the course. Those who attend enquiry nights and wish to proceed make a commitment to regular attendance for the entirety of the RCIA course—it is not for people to attend sessions on a random, occasional basis. In 2024 when a new RCIA Course will be advertised to commence, it is intended that all interested parishioners be encouraged to attend the information sessions to discern whether they wish to make a commitment to attend the full RCIA course to learn more about their Catholic faith—that is, it will be for 'long standing' Catholics as Adult Faith Formation in addition to being for those who wish to consider becoming Catholics. Once the RCIA Course has commenced times are not advertised.

Weekday Masses – Saturday? Have you considered to put back on the Saturday weekday Mass? I have been told that we used to have it many years ago.

Murwillumbah is a One Priest Parish. For those who wish to attend a Saturday morning Mass there is one available at Tweed Heads at 9.10am weekly.

Reconciliation. Could you please ask Fr Peter Wood to please consider to make the timing of Reconciliation before the Saturday Vigil 6pm Mass and the Sunday 9am Mass a bit earlier? Especially when both Reconciliation and the Rosary clash as it starts at the same time! Parishioners who go to Reconciliation at 5.30pm Saturday or 8:30am Sunday and also wish to pray the Rosary may not get the opportunity to pray the full rosary or only some of the rosary.

Again, Murwillumbah is a One Priest Parish. Extending Reconciliation times earlier is not feasible due to the many other commitments a priest has in addition to saying Mass.
