We are children of God

The Jesuit spiritual writer, Mark Link, begins his widely read book *Experiencing Prayer* (1984) with an extract from <u>Eugene Ionesco's play</u> *The Bald Soprano* (1950). In the scene, a couple meet and enter dialogue about their lives. They discover that they share much in common – they live in the same city, on the same street, in the same apartment, and they each have a daughter named Alice.

Much to their surprise, they also discover they are husband and wife.

As Mark Link observes, this story is repeated in many households, where husbands and wives, sons and daughters, rarely develop deep and abiding relationships. They never truly come to "know" their life partner or sibling, as their relationship remains "largely on the surface."

Similarly, our relationship with God is often superficial. Outwardly we may appear committed to our faith. We wear crosses, scapulars or miraculous medals. We attend Mass every Sunday. We can recite the Nicene Creed by heart, proclaiming that in Jesus, God became human.

However, many of us do not really "know" this God who became like us. We do not share an intimate relationship with the divine, the ground of all being, the life that gives us life, despite our belief in the Incarnation.

Today's gospel reminds us that we were baptised into a community that has for centuries been initiating catechumens into the faith *via* the Trinitarian formula of Father, Son and Spirit (Mt 28:19; cf. 2 Cor 13:13). Paul writes to the Romans (8:14-17) in our Second Reading, that through Baptism we are adopted into the family of God, liberated from slavery, and called to intimate relationship with the Father through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit.

Like Matthew, Paul and the first Christians saw in the coming of Christ an invitation to commune with God whose essential nature was a mutual sharing of three persons in one Godhead. As John says elsewhere, "God is love; so, whoever does not love, does not know God" (1 John 4:8).

It is because God is a trinity of persons that we can speak of God as love. But it also because God the Father sent his Son into the world that we can both know and participate in the love of God. While we can come to appreciate the love of God by looking at the divine handiwork in creation, we can only truly come to "know" God's through the divine Word made fully incarnate in Jesus of Nazareth.

The story of the Incarnation and its revelation of the Trinity teaches us that because God became human, we can become like God. Entering communion with God through Christ, we are transformed and empowered by the Spirit to transcend our limited existences, live lives of love and self-sacrifice, and inherit eternal lives in God. Like the couple in Eugene Ionesco's play, we are called to a conversation with God, which leads us to discover we are children of God.

Financial Report to the Parish for the year ended 31 December 2023

A message from the Parish Finance Council on behalf of Fr Peter Wood, Parish Administrator

This financial summary has been prepared so that you are aware of the financial activity of our parish during the period 1 January to 31 December 2023.

Members of the Parish Finance Council during 2023 were Peter McDonald-Chairperson, Jim Grennan, Kevin Twohill, Ray Daley, Wayne Bartesko and Jennifer Wallace.

The financial summary for the year ended 31 December 2023 shows a loss of \$(76,646); whilst noting that the Parish cash reserves remain healthy with \$835,360 held in cash assets.

While our income stream remains stable, our operating costs keep increasing. We continue to explore ways to attract or modify income streams for the Parish and to modify our operations to reduce expenses.

2023 was another challenging year for the Parish, with the floods of February/March 2022 continuing to have an impact on the overall operations of the Parish through 2023. Additional claims were lodged in 2023 for the retaining wall surrounding the presbytery and an escape of liquid claim has also been lodged for an unidentified leak under the Sacred Heart Church which impacts the entire area surrounding the church and hall and the retaining wall behind the church and hall. We remain in negotiations for the settlement of these two claims, each exceeding \$1 million in repairs.

Insurance costs have increased significantly in 2023 and have had a subsequent effect on our expenses for 2023. Whilst there was an increase expected, the actual increase was larger than anticipated. Catholic Church Insurance is no longer our insurer so we, along with the entire Diocese, are now paying market rates for property insurance. It should be noted that there is NO coverage for flood and the excesses payable for all other insurance products have increased significantly.

Our aging Parish buildings are in constant need of repair and maintenance. Major maintenance works scheduled for early 2023 were put on hold due to the ongoing rectification and reinstatement claims related to flood and storm damage from February/March 2022. The complexity of some of the maintenance work is a challenge, partly for safety

reasons – for example the bell tower and front façade of the Sacred Heart Church require high ropes or scaffolding attention which both attract higher costs.

We are grateful that numbers attending weekly Mass remain stable. We are aware that our parishioner base is an integral part of the continuing viability of our Parish and we note that our Pastoral Council have, during 2023, sought to engage us as a community through a number of initiatives including the Peter Kearney Concert and the Grief and Loss Workshops offered in 2023; and most recently in the Vision and Mission Workshop; and we remain committed to supporting the Pastoral Council helping to form our parish community in our faith lives.

The Parish Finance Committee remains committed to the ongoing financial viability of the Sacred Heart Parish.

Your continued generosity through both the Planned Giving Program and/or donations helps to keep the Parish financially stable. We sincerely thank you for your ongoing financial commitment throughout 2023.

Since the Parish Planned Giving Program was established 60 years ago by Monsignor O'Rourke in 1964, the program has remained an important part of our parish's income sources. We encourage all Parishioners to participate in the program according to your financial capability.
