Let the children come to me

The long form of this week's gospel reading includes some strange words that are worth our careful reflection. The disciples get annoyed at people bringing children to Jesus so that he can bless them.

You can imagine their grumbling: "We have work to do, God's work! We don't have time to waste like this. We have to make it to the next town by nightfall. Crowds are waiting to be taught. Sick need healing. Possessed need deliverance. We will be here all day with all these children ..."

The disciples, the insiders, the privileged participants in Jesus' mission, in their zeal and sincerity still miss the essential point. In fact, throughout the gospels, Jesus' most intimate friends and his most devoted followers, struggle to comprehend what following Jesus is really all about.

They put their understanding of God, of his Kingdom, of Jesus, before God, his Kingdom and Jesus. They make a box and place God, the Kingdom and Jesus inside of it, instead of letting their little box be broken open by the wonder of who God is, and what God is accomplishing in Jesus for the world (which is called the "Kingdom").

Iust like the disciples, our ideas of Jesus and his mission can be too convenient and comfortable, too idolatrous and narrow. This was the problem with Jesus' disciples and it's the problem with Jesus' disciples today.

But again and again, Jesus mercifully and patiently corrects his disciples' misunderstandings; he breaks open their all-too -narrow, all-too-convenient understandings of himself and his Kingdom.

does Jesus break open and transform our understanding in this story of the little children? It's all revealed in Jesus' response to them when they try to bar the children from coming to him: "Let the children come to me, do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these."

On the one hand, the disciples know that Jesus' mission is the Kingdom; the reign and rule of God over all the earth, the eradication of all injustice, suffering and evil, the gathering of all peoples as one in obedience to their Creator — all of this and more is Jesus' singular purpose in his teaching and in his actions. The disciples, like us, believe this and devote their entire lives to it. What is the problem, then?

Jesus' disciples continually struggle to understand this rule and reign of God.

Jesus demands a complete undoing of what we think rule and reign is. The Kingdom is not accomplished by might, strategy and self-interest, but by humility, self-sacrifice and love. Strength, wealth, good looks and smarts get you nowhere! Jesus tells us frankly: "Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the Kingdom of God like a child, will not enter it."

Volunteers needed for rosters - (i) Welcomers and (ii) Offertory Procession

We would like to reintroduce rosters for welcomers and for offertory processions at weekend Masses.

We acknowledge and thank Barbara Grant, Beth Gorton and Deirdre Hulton who, together with myself, have been undertaking the welcomer duties and organising people for the Offertory at each weekend Mass for some considerable time now.

What's involved?

Welcomers / Mass Hospitality Team

Before Mass

Welcomers are asked to arrive at the Church 20-30 minutes before Mass start time to welcome parishioners and visitors in to the church and to offer a Parish Bulletin and hymn sheet/book to each person. Ideally at least one person remains at the welcome table until the Liturgy of the Word commences.

Placing the money from the collection plates into money bags and putting the bags into a special location as Mass commences (the rostered Acolyte or Parish Manager collects the money after Mass).

We recommend two people per Mass to welcome everyone into the Church – one of whom must be an adult. After Mass

Tidying up the hospitality table after Mass as people return bulletins and hymn sheets.

Offertory Procession

Ideally two or more people; often from the same family or friendship group.

Taking the gifts of bread and wine from the Credence Table located in the middle of the church up to meet Father at the sanctuary steps at the appropriate time in Mass and then returning to your seat.

We invite you to add your name to one or both lists if you and partner/family/friends would like to be involved. The list is available at the back of the church. Alternatively contact the Parish office to advise which roster you'd like to be added to.

If you are interested in other ministries e.g. reading or music/choir; or in joining the roster for our monthly Sunday Cuppa team – please speak to one of our Parish team and we can talk to you more about what's involved as some training/practice may be involved.

If you are new to the parish and interested in joining a Family Group, please speak to me about how to join a Family Group.

The rosters will be prepared in the Parish Office and be circulated on a quarterly basis.

Thank you for your continued support of the Parish through these activities.

Keeping the faith: What happens when a priest is absent?

Sunday Mass has always been and will continue to be central in Catholic life and worship, but what happens when a priest is unavailable?

Supporting parishes

Providing parishes with the resources, protocols and processes for lay-led liturgy is a key part of the Renewal Journey. Kurt Challinor, Principal of St Joseph's Primary School in Alstonville, leads the lay-led liturgy team. "We're working collaboratively with parishes across the Diocese to discern their immediate and future needs in supporting lay-led liturgies," explains Kurt.

He notes that while these liturgies provide a spiritual outlet, they are not a replacement for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. "It's important for communities to know the difference between the two because they are very different."

Feedback from parishes has been instrumental in shaping what form of support they need for lay-led liturgies. A recent survey had a 90% response rate, highlighting the diverse realities. "Some parishes have been doing this for years, while others are just beginning to explore it," Kurt shares.

While lay-led liturgies cannot replace the Eucharistic celebration presided over by a priest, they ensure that parishioners continue to gather, worship, and receive Holy Communion. "We come together in the hope of celebrating the Liturgy of the Eucharist in the future," says Kurt.

Through the Renewal Journey, parishes across the Diocese are ensuring that the spiritual growth of communities continues, even when a priest isn't available.
